FAMILY & INDIVIDUAL STABILIZATION

Our Office of Family & Individual Stabilization, which houses all direct service and case management, is the foundational pillar of support for our Latino families and individuals. In 2013 the City of Chattanooga gave La Paz the title of Latino Family Resource Center. We take this title very seriously, acting as a guide and connector for Latino families in our city.

From housing support to medical debt relief, our in-house staff & organizational partners together provide wraparound social support with caring dispositions and, more importantly, the language skills and cultural awareness to **meet our community where they are**.

HOMEOWNERSHIP

Homeownership among
Hispanic/Latino populations in the
U.S. continues to grow at a steady
rate, although in 2022, the percentage
of Latino homeownership was 48%.

Since 2022, La Paz has partnered with local Latino realtors, mortgage experts, and financial coaches to provide educational programming and support for families looking to invest in real estate (many the first generation to do so).

Our realtors have reported that six workshop participants achieved homeownership in 2023.

Under CE&E, La Paz provides educational support and wealth building opportunities for students, families, and small businesses as well as community building and engagement.

2023 took the title of the most diverse offering of educational and resource opportunities to date in one year! This year we focused on a range of topics that the community expressed as a need, and partnered with various local, statewide and national organizations to bridge access.
